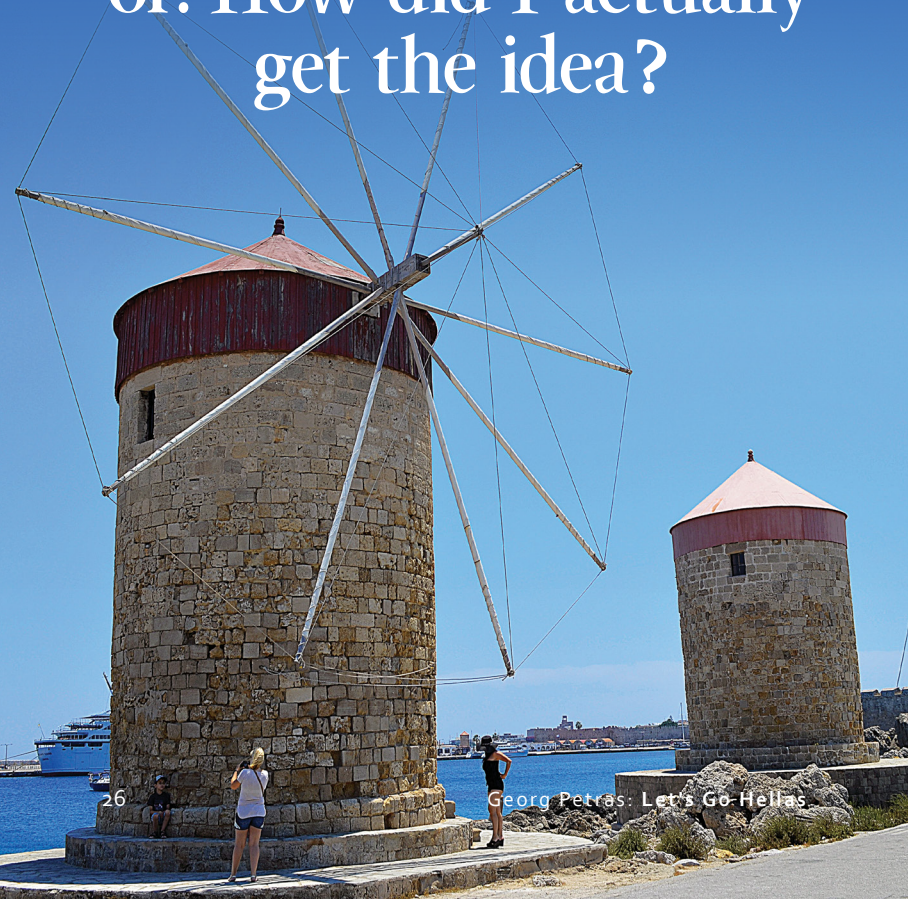

Chapter 3

Evlogimeno – the blessed island or: How did I actually get the idea?



Greece is very rich. It has hundreds of islands and over 300 days of sun per year on holiday islands such as Rhodes, Crete, Corfu and Mykonos as well as millions of tourists - in 2016 it was over 27 million.
